John Bushnell removed with his parents to Starksboro, Vt. abt. 1794, where he probably married his first wife. In 1816 he went to Ashtabula co. Ohio, and took up a full section of land near Monroe then returned to Starksboro, Vt. In 1817 he sold his lands in Starkboro, and in the same year, he and his brother Sedgwick moved their families and their belongings to Ohio, John driving a span of horses and bringing the women and children and the clothing while Sedgwick drove three pair of oxen with their furniture, the trip lasting six weeks. In 1819 John Bushnell married as his second wife, his second cousin, Elizabeth Ensign, a grand daughter of Jacob Ensign (who m. Sarah Graves), who was a twin brother of John Bushnell's grandfather John Ensign (who m. Mary Sedgwick). During the same year he was a Township Trustee for the town of Monroe. Shortly after the birth of his son, James Sedgwick, he with his family removed to Illinois, and settled near Payson or Plainville, where they continued to reside until the death of his wife, who with the son James Sedgwick, were buried in Ackers Chapel Cemetery near Plainville. James Bushnell accompanied his parents when they removed to Starksboro, Vt. in 1794, and in 1800 subscribed to the Freemans Oath in Addison, Vt. On 10 Oct. 1810, he bought a tract of land from Samuel Ambros which he presumably sold to his brother Samuel, 11 Sept. 1811. In a letter written to his sister Polly from Constable, N.Y. dated 17 Jan. 1818 he refers to the making of Axes which seems to imply that he was a blacksmith. In the last paragraph of this letter, he says, "Manny and little Sally have been here about a week and are well. I think I shall not come out until spring. Give my love to Fanny and Lois and all your family." As he mentions four of his then five children, it is presumed that his son Robert had died young. There is no record as far as known that would indicate that he settled in this section and it is known that about 1820 he with Capt. Pliny Miller, purchased a tract or some 300 acres of land where the town of Saranac Lake was later located, selling his share soon after to his partner, Capt. Miller, who settled on the land about 1822. It seems to be the opinion of some that he left Saranac Lake soon after the completion of this transaction, but where he went has not yet been discovered. About 1803/4 he removed to Hartford, Ohio, and built the Congregational Church there in 1819, and when a minister was not to be had he conducted the religious services. He was a member of the Masonic Fraternity and in the later years of his life was a member of the M.E. Church. William Bushnell removed with his father to Hartland and on 31 Dec. 1800, bought land in Hartford, Trumbull co. Ohio to which the family removed in 1801, being the first of his father's family to migrate. He was elected Capt. of the first military unit of the town and later was Colonel of the Regiment, and was one of the Commissioners of the County and filled other important County and Township offices. Sterling Graves Bushnell was named after the minister of the Congregational Church at East Hartland, m. at North Granby, Conn. 28 Nov. 1822, they were admitted as members of the church at East Hartland. He was justice of the Peace at Hartland and a surveyor, tanner, and farmer. In the winter of 1804 the family removed by sled to Ohio, following the lake shore to Buffalo, N.Y. thence on ice to Ashtabula, Ohio, and settled in Vernon, Ohio then an unbroken wilderness. Many of the sections of the Western Reserve in Ashtabula, Medina, Lorain, and Trumbull counties were surveyed and marked by him. He served in the War of 1812 as an Adjutant, and in 1815 built a flat boat, and loading it with butter and cheese, floated to New Orleans where he sold his cargo and returned to Ohio on horseback. The next year he made a second trip to New Orleans, returning to New York by water, and by stage coach to Ohio. In 1820 they removed to Hayesville, Ohio, about one mile east of the present town. He was a charter member of Jerusalem Lodge, F. & A. M. and its second W. M. His first five children were born in Hartland, Conn. while the others were born in Vernon, Ohio. He was buried in Mansfield, Ohio.

It is unfortunate that the birth records of the Hanover Church for some 50 years between 1780 and 1830 only give the sex of the child, the name of one parent, usually the father, and a date, which perhaps was the date the record was made and not the birth date. The record date is given here.

Jesse Bushnell, of Hanover, Conn. was a farmer and died intestate at an early age. His estate, consisting of 17 acres of land with buildings, was inventoried at \$1071.53 and the administrators bond was signed by Hannah Bushnell, Dyer Bushnell (her brother-in-law) and Joshua Kirtland. On 22 Nov. 1811, Dyer Bushnell sold the Property to the widow's dower.

It is not known when she removed to Pomfret, Conn. or whether her children went with her, but in 1816, she m. Archelaus White, and perhaps it was her daughter Sally, who by a Pomfret record, m. William Foster there, on 27 Dec. 1823.

While the names of her children have not been found in the records, other than that of her son, Harry who died young, the Spaulding Genealogy shows that she had a sister Audrey who m. Dyer Bushnell, and brothers Stephen and Willard, and as Dyer Bushnell named his eldest son, Willard Spaulding, evidently after one of the brothers, it is assumed that Jesse named his eldest son Stephen Spaulding after the other brother. Further evidence is presented by Mrs. Frances Bushnell Cook, youngest daughter of Stephen Spaulding Bushnell, who, while unable to give the names of her grand-parents, did have an old Bible in which the date of birth of her father was given as "Stephen Spaulding Bushnell, b. Lysbon, Conn. 30 Mar. 1795," which is the recorded date of the birth of Jesse's oldest son; Mrs. Cook also advised that her mother had often stated that, "There was a brother, Harry, who had gone to New York State, and had several sisters whose names were unknown."

In 1824 a Harry Bushnell settled in Utica, N.Y. coming there from Connecticut as stated by a grand-daughter of Harry's, however the Superintendent of the Cemetery in Utica, where Harry is buried, states that his records show that Harry was born in Warren, N.Y. on 27 July 1799, or about five years earlier than by the Hanover record. While this discrepancy has not been resolved, it is apparent that he was connected to a Hanover family, and presumably that of Jesse, for Mrs. Fanny Keith of Albany, N.Y. who recently died, aged over 100 years, identified him as a nephew of her grand-mother Lydia Bushnell Turner, in the

statement that, "Harry's Aunt Hannah, sister to my grand-mother, married a wealthy churchman of Albany named Herman Pumpelly." and her grand-mother is positively identified as a sister of Jesse in several deeds recorded in Lisbon. Also Mrs. Grace Alexander Shaul, a grand-daughter of Harry's, stated that her mother had a cousin named Samuel Brewster, and two of Jesse's sisters married Brewsters.

Asa Bushnell shortly after marriage and birth of their first child removed to Middletown Springs, Vt. where on 13 May 1786, he bought a farm of about 40 acres to which he added 30 acres on 12 June 1790. He may have moved to Lee, N.Y. about 1792, as on 4 May of that year he sold a part or all of his farm to Buell Caswell. Amasa Bushnell probably removed to Albany, N.Y. before his marriage, where he engaged in business as a jeweler and also as a dentist, with much success. After a number of years his failing health induced him to remove with his family to California, going via the Isthmus of Panama. He settled in San Francisco first and planted a garden on the corner of 10th and Brannan Sts. in which he had some hop plants which he had brought from the east. He later experimented with them in other localities, especially near Redwood City, and about 1858, he bought 248 acres in the El Molino Grant in Green Valley, Sonoma County, and here he specialized in hop culture for about twenty years. Cornelius Scranton Bushnell shipped on a coasting vessel at the age of 15, and a year later was half owner and master of a 60 ton Schooner in the coastal trade between New Haven and New York, but after five years as a mariner, forsook the sea to enter the wholesale grocery business with his brother, Nathan Townsend (1201) Bushnell in New Haven in which he continued for many years, although active in many other enterprises.

In 1858 he became interested in the bankrupt New Haven and New London R.R. and with his own capital and credit, and that of some of his friends, was successful in completing in 1860, a connection with the Providence road at Stonington, which established a through route between Boston and New York, and with favorable legislation, solved the immediate difficulties of the road.

He had been elected president of the railroad and was in Washington, D.C. on railroad business early in 1861 when the Civil War broke out, and upon call for volunteers to defend the Capitol until such time as regular troops could be moved there, he enlisted with the Cassius H. Clay Batallion on the 13th, and was mustered in 18 Apr. 1861, and after the arrival of the 6th Massachusetts Infantry was discharged the 4 May next, his Honorable Discharge being signed by President Lincoln.

By the capture of the Norfolk Navy Yard early in 1861, the Confederates obtained the hull of a 3500 ton frigate which had been burned and sunk when the Federal forces left Norfolk, and it was discovered that the machinery was not damaged, and that the hull could be salvaged, thereupon work was soon commenced upon an iron-clad battery, later to b. known as the Merrimac, which with its antagonist the Monitor, was to revolutionize naval construction the world over. This project was known in Washington

and Mr. Bushnell, appreciating the necessity for predominance in sea power, both offensive and defensive, and that it must be developed quickly, prepared to open a ship yard in Fair Haven, Conn. and with the assistance of Mr. S. H. Pook of Boston, an expert Naval Construction, plans for an iron clad vessel, later known as the Galena, were prepared and submitted to the newly created Naval Board, who approved the design, and with a contract for its construction, he prepared to leave for New Haven, but in the meantime doubts had arisen, as to its stability with its heavy armor, and it was suggested that he consult with Capt. John Ericsson of New York, an expert in naval construction, and an inventor, and fortunate it was for the preservation of our national unity that he did so, for it was at this conference with Capt. Ericsson that plans were exhibited and the model for a battery with a revolving turret, that would be impervious to shot and shell, and which could be built in 90 days, which he had designed for the French Government about 1854, but which had not been accepted.

Mr. Bushnell immediately perceived in this small model the ideal craft for which he had been seeking, and eight days later, after having with consumate tact overcome all objections, succeeded in forcing upon the Government the adoption of the impregnable turret, which has since become standard with all the navies of the world. This battery, the "Monitor', so named as an admonition to foreign-governments to be cautious, or "Cheesebox on a Raft" as it was derisively called, was about 180 feet long with 41 foot bean, was launched at Greenport, L.I. on 30 Jan. 1862, and on 9 Mar. 1862, the day following the partial destruction of the Federal Fleet in Hampton Roads, met the Merrimac and after a terrific battle sent her back to her anchorage wounded unto death. Because of a clause which had been added to the contract, the contractors were required to guarantee its satisfactory performance, and as there had not been sufficient time for the official tests, the ship when it went into the battle was the property of the contractors, Mr. Bushnell, Mr. John F. Winslow, Mr. John A. Griswold, and Mr. Ericsson. The Government had not built or paid for her, and the red tape of the Government Bureaus had almost laughed her to scorn.

On 31 Dec. 1862, the Monitor foundered in a severe gale off Cape Hatteras with 17 man and 4 officers, while on its way to Charleston, S.C. All honor is due to Capt. John Ericsson's talent, but his designs were of no practical value until another, more resourceful and bold appeared to push his idea to completion.

In 1862 Mr. Bushnell became one of the original organizers of the Union Pacific R.R. and the only one who remained until its completion, and for many years was the sole survivor of the original Board of Directors. A station in Nebraska was named Bushnell in his honor.

He amassed a large fortune by his early enterprises, but was unfortunate in advancing capital for later enterprises, such as the Atlantic and Pacific R.R. the development of iron and coal properties, and in giving endorsements and guarantee bonds, for which he suffered the loss of a large part of his fortune.

He was a member of the Consolidated Exchange, Admiral Foote Post G.A.R. and an Honorary Member of the Army and Navy Club of Connecticut, and died in San Remo Hotel, New York, N.Y. buried Evergreen Cemetery, New Haven. On 30 May 1906 a Memorial was unveiled in New Haven to his memory, and in commemoration of his

great achievement.

Hon. Nehemiah Bushnell graduated Yale University 1835, studied law in Cambridge, Mass. and admitted to Bar in Middletown, Conn. 1837, removed to Quincy, Ills. soon, where he began the practice of law with Hon. Orville H. Browning after having edited the Quincy Whig for a short time. He was identified with some of the more important public improvements in the western part of the a state, and from 1851 to 1861, was president of the Northern Cross R.R. which he helped to build and after being absorbed by the Burlington R.R. he was appointed Attorney and Councillor for that road, which position he held until his death. In the Fall of 1872 he represented the city in the General Assembly. During the Civil War his home was the center for the Needle Pickets, and a general meeting place for all societies for the relief of the soldiers. He was the founder of the Church of the Good Shepherd in which a baptismal fount has been placed in his memory, and other memorials for other members of his family. Bushnell, Illinois, was named in his honor while he was President of the railroad, the first public sale of lots being in May 1854. 

Rev. Dr. Horace Bushnell, (D.D. L.L.D.) in his younger years worked on his father's farm, and at age of 15 attended the High School in New Preston, Conn. In 1823 he entered Yale University to prepare for the Bar and graduated 1827, after which he became Principal of the Chelsea Grammar School in Norwich, Conn. but in Feb. 1828 resigned to become Editor of the New York Journal of Commerce, where he remained the balance of the year. In 1829 he returned to New Haven as a Law student and accepted the office of Tutor in Yale College where he remained 1829-31 when he received the call for his life's work and after two years in Yale Divinity School, was ordained 22 May 1833, and appointed Pastor of the Old North Church in Hartford where he remained for over a quarter of a century. In 1840 he was offered the Presidency of Millbury College, Vermont, which he did not accept, and 1842 received the degree of Doctor of Divinity from Weslyean College, and in 1852 a similar degree from Harvard University. In 1847 he published his first work, "Christian Nurture," followed in 1849 by "God in Christ," with an introductory dissertation on the language as related to thought, in which it was charged that he had expressed heretical views as to the Trinity. He was tried and acquitted by a vote or 17 to 3 after which his church withdrew from the consociation by which he had been tried and from then on stood alone, a true Congregational church whose minister was not amenable to any external authority. While in California for his health in 1856, he was instrumental in the establishment of the College of California at Oakland, later merged with the University of California, of which he also refused the Presidency, and in Jan. 1857, returned to New England, but his health finally forced his retirement and in July 1859 he preached his farewell sermon, and on 22nd Nov. tendered his formal resignation, after which he went to Minnesota, where he hoped to recover his health. He returned in 1861 much improved and during the days of the Civil War, devoted his time and energies to his writing and to the cause of the Government and his Parishioners. In 1871 he received tile Degree of Doctor of Laws from Yale University. It was through his efforts that the city dumping ground in Hartford was converted into a beautiful park, the second city park in the United States, which was named, "Bushnell Park." He died in his 74th year from the ravages of consumption, and it is interesting to know that his influence on religious thought and freedom is still manifest. One of the greatest orations of America was delivered by him at the Centennial of Litchfield, Conn. "The Age of Homespun." His principal publications were Christian Nurture; God in Christ; Christ in Theology; Sermons for the New Life; Nature and the Supernatural; Work and Play; Christ and Womans Suffrage; Sermons on Living Subjects; and Forgiveness and Law. He was buried in North Cemetery, Hartford, Conn.

For 60 years he was identified with the Aetna National Bank of Hartford, and his benefactions included numerous gifts to the Windsor Avenue Congregational Church, the Hillyer Institute and the Y.M.C.A. to which is father had donated the original site. While her benefactions were many and varied, the greatest gift was the memorial to her father, The Bushnell Memorial Auditorium, costing about one and one-half million dollars, and seating thirty-three hundred people, which was begun 1 July 1928 and dedicated by a series of concerts beginning 15 Jan. 1930. Her interest in the City Park System resulted in her election to the City Park Board, upon which she served from 1911 to her resignation in 1920, having been Vice-President in 1915 and refusing to serve as President. In 1916 she endowed, in memory of her father, the Chair of Christian Nurture at Yale Divinity School, and for years she was identified with numerous civic and cultural societies of Hartford, such as the Hartford Choral Society, Musical Club, Saturday Morning Club, Woman's Club, Hartford Oratoria Society of which she was Honorary Vice-President and was active in many phases of Congregational Church work. At her death she was Honorary President of the Bushnell Auditorium Corporation, and a few years before her death, Trinity College had conferred upon her the honorary degree of Master of Arts. Rev. George Bushnell, (D.D.), worked in his youth on his father's farm, and in 1842 graduated from Yale University, after which, for a few months, he taught school in West Hartford, Conn. then in Oct. 1843, entered Auburn, N.Y. Theological Seminary from which two years later he transferred to Yale Divinity School from which he graduated in 1846. He accepted no call until 13 Dec. 1848, when he was ordained over the Salem Street Congregational Church in Worcester Mass. which pastorate he held until Dec. 1856, when he resigned to act as Superintendent of Public Schools in Worcester. On 29 Sept. 1858, he was called to the First Congregational Church of Waterbury, Conn. which he resigned 31 Jan. 1865 to accept a call to the First Congregational Church of Beloit, Wis. where he served from 2 Mar. 1865 until his health forced him to resign on 5 May 1884, returning a few months later to New Haven, Conn. where he continued to reside until his death. Henry Clinton Bushnell, b. Vermont or Massachusetts, came with his parents in 1817 to Monroe, Ohio, and some six or more years after his father's 2nd marriage, removed with them and their younger children to Adams county, Ills. where they settled near Payson or Plainville, while he probably went to Galena, Ills. to work in the lead mines there. Not long after, he discovered lead near Beetown, Wis. which he mined until the increasing difficulties led him to abandon the project. In 1827 he visited

his father in Illinois, and while there met Adeline Scholl, who had come to Pike county with her parents in the fall of the previous year. Soon after their marriage they settled at Muskellunge, Wis. but in 1828, moved to a place later known as Bushnell Hollow, a short distance north-west of Lancaster, Wis. When the Black Hawk War broke out, in which he took a part, they took refuge in Fort Crawford, and later in the block house at Cassville, where she and Mrs. Price, the wife of the Commandant, and for whom they named their daughter, Harriet Price, became lifelong friends. Soon after hostilities had ceased they returned to the farm in Muskallunge where she remained until her death. About 1848 he again visited his father in Illinois, and on his return to Wisconsin was accompanied by his father, who had turned his property over to his daughter Mary and her husband, William Davis. George Willis Bushnell came to Ohio with his parents in 1803, and was first a farmer, then engaged in carpenter work after which he studied the Allopathic System of Medicine and received the honorary degree of M.D. from the Physico-Medico Institute of Cincinnati, Ohio. Rev. Wells Bushnell was employed as a striker and blower in a blacksmith shop in Pittsburgh, Penna. 1816/7, attended the Academy there, and was a member of the First Presbyterian Church. Harry Bushnell, b. probably in that part of Lisbon, Conn. now known as Hanover, 27 July 1799 (by Bushnell monument), 8 June 1804 (by Hanover Record), came to Utica, N.Y. in 1824, perhaps from Warren, N.Y. Rev. Albert Bushnell was born at Canterbury Hill, near Rome, N.Y. where his father had settled in 1817, and became a member of the Second Presbyterian Church at age of 12 years. He studied at Oberlain College, Oberlain, Ohio and in June 1843 graduated from Lane Theological Seminary in Cincinnati, Ohio, and on 1 Jan. 1844 sailed from Boston, Mass. as a missionary, connected with the Gaboon Mission at the mouth of the Gaboon river on the west coast of Africa. In 1852 while on a visit to the United States he had the Gospel of St. John printed into the Mpongwe Language, after which he translated the whole Bible into the same language and during the last year of his stay superintended

its publication (R-67-68). In 1878 he again visited the United States and on the return voyage died at Sierra Leone a few minutes after the vessel had reached port and was buried there. His wife continued on to their destination at Gaboon.

Capt. William Edward Bushnell began his career at the age of 12 when he stood his trick at the wheel of his father's vessel the "Thames," and after a few years on coasting vessels, shipped as able seaman on the "Congress" going around the Horn to Valparaiso and Arica, Chile, and upon his return he went as second officer of the "Hiram" to Rio Grande, Brazil, arriving in time to witness the ceremonies attending the coronation of Dom Pedro as Emperor of Brazil. He next made a whaling voyage, which lasted three years, returning to New London, Conn. in June 1848. He then went as second officer of the "Henry Lee" from New York to San Francisco, Calif. which took about 7 months and on 5 Nov. 1849, he made his first trip as pilot of the "Senator" up the Sacramento river and from then until his last illness, was in command as Captain or Pilot of steam vessels navigating the inland waters of California. On 7 Sept. 1852, he was appointed the first U.S. Steamboat Inspector on the Pacific Coast, and in 1860 was the first pilot to be licensed on Puget Sound and Georgia Bay. Of the larger steamers which he commanded as pilot or captain, there were the "Senator," "Antelope," "Confederacy," "Wilson G. Hunt," "Alameda," "El Capitan," "Oakland." "New World," and for the last decade of his life he commanded the ferry steamer "Piedmont," transporting the many thousands of Passengers between Oakland and San Francisco, and tourists from all over the world. Richard Wells Bushnell, after leaving school, served a three year apprenticeship in the Roger Locomotive Works at Paterson, N.J. then going to Hartford, Conn. for further instruction, and in 1853 removed to Chicago, Ills. and for four years was with the Galena and Chicago Union R.R. (later absorbed by the C. & N.W. R.R.) during a part of the time he was engineer of the Pioneer, the first locomotive to run out of Chicago; he later took charge of the company shops at Harlan (now Oak Park). In 1868 he was promoted to Master Mechanic of the Galena Division and removed to Chicago where he remained until 16 Sept. 1872, when he removed

Winthrop Grant Bushnell graduated Yale University 1888, and in his Freshman year was elected to the editorial board of the News, and in his senior year became its financial manager. He was President of the Freshman Football Association and on the team, and a member of the class crew in 1885, he won the Cleveland Cup in his senior year. He was a bass soloist at St. Pauls Church

in New Haven and sang with the University Glee Club.
